SUMMER AT LAKE EDWARD

ForestrySA has completed improvements to facilities at popular Lake Edward near Glencoe in time for the summer school holidays.

Investment by ForestrySA with assistance from Green Corps has resulted in improved access to the boat ramp, interpretive signs and a walkway complete with bird hides.

Lake Edward is situated 7 kilometres north of Glencoe and 30 kilometres northwest of Mount Gambier. The lake is part of an extinct volcanic crater covering 30 hectares with an average depth of 4.2 metres.

The Lake Edward conservation zone provides valuable habitat for many waterbird species, as well as a valued recreation area for fishers and canoeists. Motorized vessels are not allowed on the lake.

Lake Edward is a safe and fun option for families on a hot summer day.
