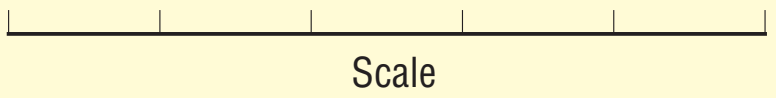
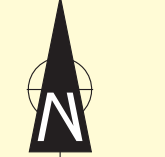
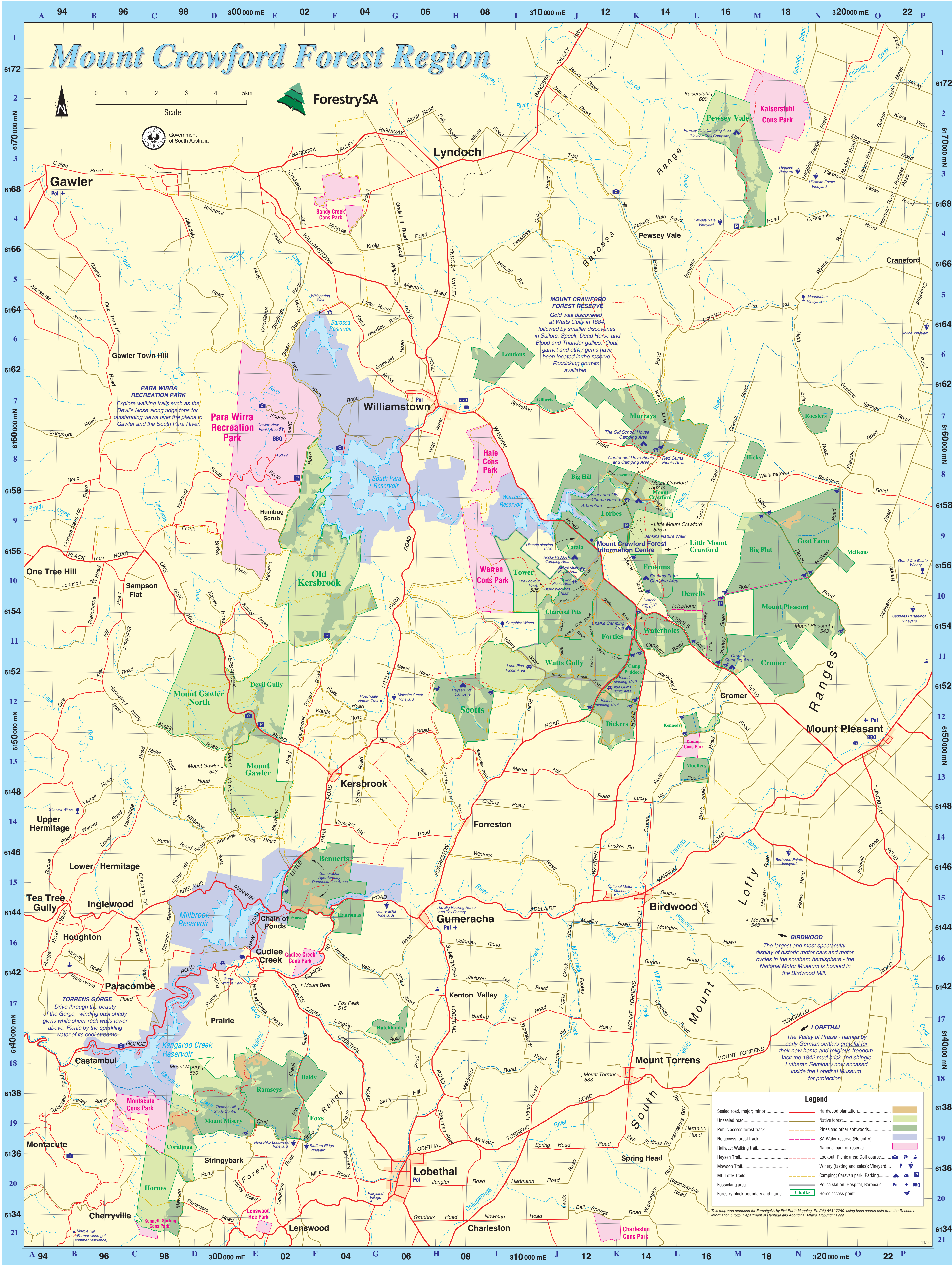

MOUNT CRAWFORD FOREST RESERVE
Gold was discovered at Watts Gully in 1884, followed by smaller discoveries in Sailors, Speck, Dead Horse and Blood and Thunder gulches. Opal, garnet and other gems have been located in the reserve. Fossicking permits available.

PARA WIRRA RECREATION PARK
Explore walking trails such as the Devil's Nose along ridge tops for outstanding views over the plains to Gawler and the South Para River.

BIRDWOOD
The largest and most spectacular display of historic motor cars and motor cycles in the southern hemisphere - the National Motor Museum is housed in the Birdwood Mill.

LOBETHAL
The Valley of Praise - named by early German settlers grateful for their new home and religious freedom. Visit the 1842 mud brick and shingle Lutheran Seminary now encased inside the Lobethal Museum for protection.
