Road transport safety will be the focus of a workshop for Mount Lofty Ranges forest industry members later this month.

Transport and load safety training will be provided to attendees on the day, as part of Australian Forest Contractors Association's (AFCA) Professional Ownership and Driver Wellbeing (PODW) initiative.

The PODW training presentation focuses on the human factors – fatigue, inattention and complacency - involved in transport accidents. It will be facilitated by AFCA's Alan Pincot and trucking accident survivor turned safety speaker, James Woods.

ForestrySA Manager Work Health Safety and Compliance Amie Power said more than 45 local timber industry representatives were already registered to attend.

"Decisions made at work have the ability to change our personal lives forever," she said.
