

### DRY CREEK TRAIL



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**Distance:** 5 km loop walk

**Allow:** 2 hours for walkers, more for slower paced.

**Terrain:** A shady forest walk with reasonably flat ground and small rocky steep sections into the creek bed. Suitable for walking with standard sturdy footwear.

**Features:** The trail meanders through herb-rich woodland shaded by Swamp Gum, Manna Gum and Stringy Bark. The trail passes through the Dry Creek bed; keep an eye out for kangaroos and wallabies as you explore the trail. Look for mushrooms and flowers though the Mossy Forest, Grassland and Wildflower Gully. Can you spot the cliff painting as you take in the scenic views of the river? Is it a possum or a lizard? Has it rained? Take the Rock Pool Fire Track and admire the colours of the little pools and the dry creek from above.

### WAGON TRAIL LOOP

**Distance:** 1.2 km loop walk

**Allow:** 45mins for walkers, more for slower paced.

**Terrain:** Mainly open grassland, with some steep inclines and rocky surfaces. Suitable for walking with standard sturdy footwear.

**Features:** Take a trip back in time and explore the Dry Creek bed which was once a tributary of the Glenelg River. Explore the Castle Rocks; are you a King or Queen and can you find the throne? Can you find the wagon wheel ruts in the limestone? Imagine horse drawn coaches travelling this route to get to Portland via McLennan's Punt. The caves along the trail have bones of animals no longer found here and are home to the critically endangered Southern Bent-wing Bat. Look out for wombats in the creek and kangaroos in the grassland. Don't forget your hat!
