

WILAMPA TRAIL



Wilampa Trail


Suitable for walkers, cyclists and horse riders, this multi-use loop trail recognises traditional owners, the Kurna people. The name 'Wilampa' comes from Kurna language meaning 'black cockatoo with yellow or white feathers', in recognition of the endangered Yellow Tailed Black Cockatoo known to inhabit the forest and feed on the seeds of pinecones. Starting at gate BF12 off Bedlam Flat Road, the trail traverses a network of fire tracks through pine plantation and a mixture of hardwood species. Sections of the trail follow the creek line and passes the Second Valley Forest depot and historic sheep yards. **Distance:** 7 km return. **Time:** allow 2 hours to walk or 1 hour to ride the whole trail.
